

Ronald E. McNair Post-baccalaureate Achievement Program Wayne State University

The Ronald E. McNair Post-baccalaureate Achievement Program is one of the U.S. Department of Education-funded TRIO Programs, a group of eight outreach programs designed to support and assist students from disadvantaged backgrounds to progress through the academic pipeline from middle school to attainment of a post-baccalaureate degree. The McNair Program funds four-year, post-secondary institutions to increase the number of doctoral degrees earned by students from underrepresented populations. Institutions work closely with McNair participants as they complete their undergraduate requirements to encourage them to enroll in graduate programs and to track their progress through to the successful completion of advanced degrees.

Students must meet the following **ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA** to be considered for the McNair Achievement Program:

- U.S. citizen or permanent resident of the United States of America
- Considered low income, first-generation college student, and/or a member of a traditionally underrepresented group in higher education (e.g. African American, Hispanic/Latino, American Indian/Alaskan Native, or student with a disability)
 - According to Federal government guidelines, a first-generation student is one whose parents have not earned a Bachelor's degree. If you lived
 with only one parent before the age of 18, consider the educational status of only that parent.
- Aspiring to pursue graduate studies with the goal of earning a Ph.D.
 - Students wishing to pursue law, dentistry, medicine, optometry or veterinary careers are not eligible for this program unless they intend to do a dual degree that includes a Ph.D.
- Cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or higher
- Full-time student at Wayne State enrolled in a minimum of 12 credit hours.
- No less than 36 credits until degree completion
- Declared Major
- Participants of LSAMP, Math Corps and STEM related Student Organizations are strongly encouraged to apply
