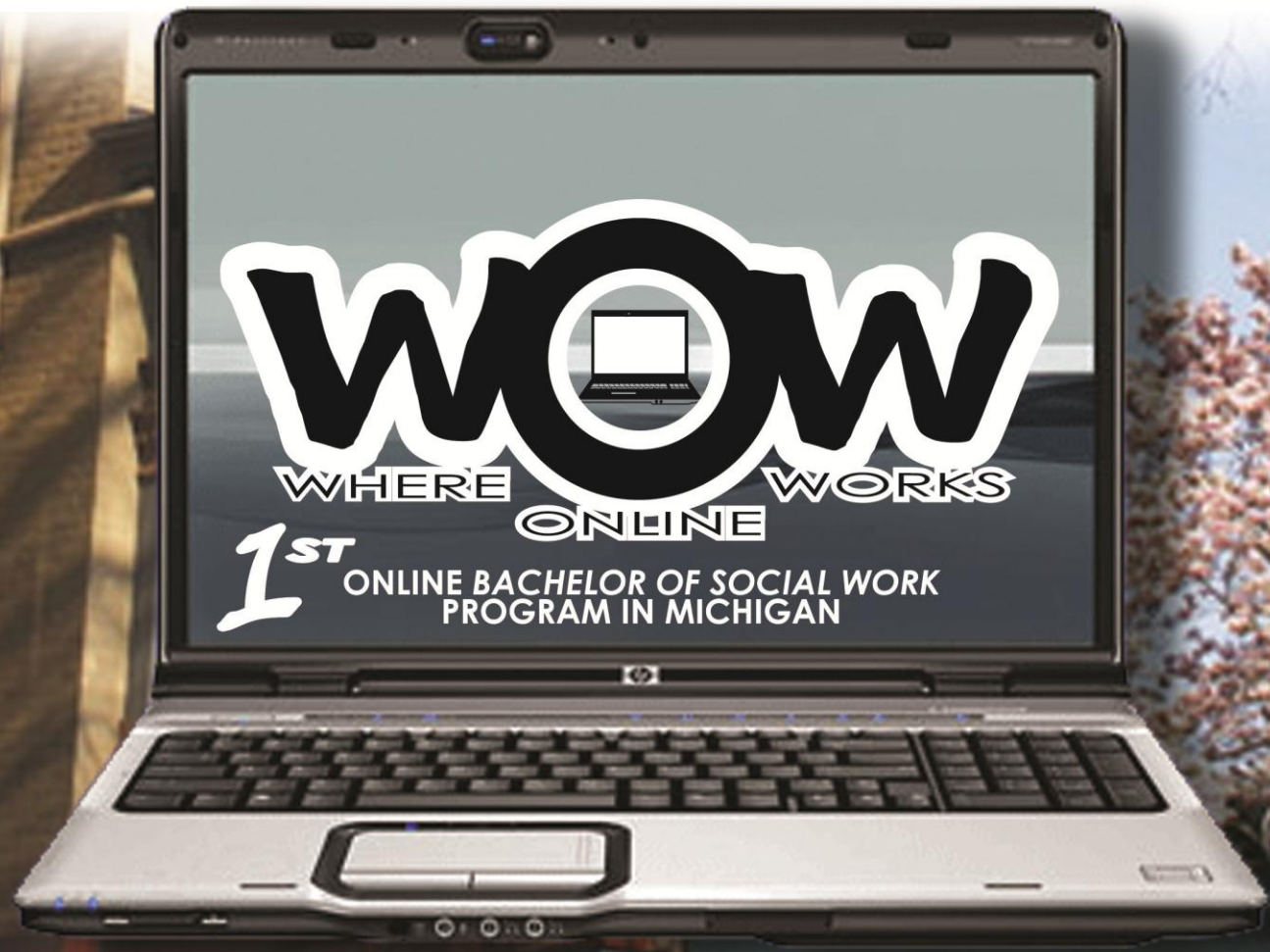

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Frequently Asked Questions

How do I apply to the Bachelor of the Social Work program?

Admission to the BSW online program occurs in the winter term only. Apply online at www.socialwork.wayne.edu. All applicants must also apply to Wayne State University at www.admission.wayne.edu.

When can I apply?

Applications are currently being accepted

When is the deadline to apply?

December 1

What are the admission requirements?

- Complete 64 credit hours
- Minimum 2.5 GPA or better
- Completion of all social work pre-professional courses
- Regular access to an updated computer system and related software necessary for successful completion of college-level courses.

How long will it take to complete the BSW program?

It takes five semesters to complete the program.

Are there field placements?

A substantial portion of the professional component is field work, which provides learning experience in the actual practice of social work. Block Field placement is during the 4th semester (winter), Monday- Thursday for 8 hours per day.

Is Math required?

All students seeking a degree from Wayne State University must complete MATH 0993 and/or MATH 1000 (or transfer an equivalent course from a community college) prior to admission to the program. Students that have not completed math competency must enroll in Math 0993 during the first semester in the program.

What type of technology is needed?

Students will need regular access to an updated computer, internet services, and a webcam (optional).

What kind of software is needed?

WOW! uses Blackboard, Skype, Yahoo Messenger and Wimba technology
